



Providing escorted transportation and non-medical support services in the Quad Cities to enable adults unable to drive to live independently and safely in their homes—all at NO COST to our Neighbors!

ELIGIBILITY AND ENROLLMENT

Eligibility for Services

- 18 or older
- Reside in Prescott, Prescott Valley, Chino Valley or Dewey
- Unable to drive, either permanently or temporarily, because of age, illness, or vision loss
- Able to enter and exit home with minimal assistance*
- Live independently, and not in an assisted living community (may qualify if living with a spouse or family member)
- Have limited access to support from family or the community
- Does not require a full-sized oxygen tank
- Able to call PWC's office on their own behalf

**Minimal assistance is defined as providing a steady arm momentarily. Volunteers are not able to lift or pull. People who can transfer unassisted from walkers or wheelchairs into and out of vehicles can be transported. PWC cannot transport wheelchairs, so if a wheelchair is needed, clients must make arrangements for one to be made available at the destination.*

Enrollment Process

Step 1: Initial Call

- Interested client (Neighbor) telephones PWC.
 - PWC gathers preliminary information required to assess needs and determine eligibility.
- Call must be made by the potential client, and not by someone calling on his or her behalf.*

Step 2: In-Person Interview

- PWC Intake Coordinator contacts potential client to set up a home visit.
- Completes a 1-2 hour home visit to gather more information on needs and to confirm the person's circumstances.

Step 3: Application Review

- PWC Program Committee reviews application and makes eligibility decision.
- Notifies potential client of eligibility decision.
- If eligible, new client (Neighbor) may request services immediately.

The enrollment process may take up to three weeks to complete.

PWC's Services

- Escorted transportation for essential needs – healthcare appointments (2/week limit), pharmacy visits, grocery shopping
- Technology assistance
- Personal paperwork
- Friendly visits and telephone calls
- Pets-to vets
- Home safety – assessments and minor repairs
- Non-medical family caregiver relief
- Grocery shopping assistance
- Low vision services

All services based on volunteer availability
